Elza Kolodin' s career as a pianist began at the Special School for Music in Krakow under Zofia Zagajewska. After being granted a scholarship from the Chopin Society she continued her studies at the Music Academy in Warsaw under Ryszard Bakst and Zbigniew Drzewiecki.

After her emigration the Foundation Albert Roussel enabled her to complete her studies at the Ecole Normale de Musique in Paris in the class of Thierry de Brunhoff, a master pupil of Alfred Cortot. She graduated with the highest distinction, the "Licence de concert à l'unanimité du jury". There followed many prizes at international piano competitions. Her concerts and recitals have taken her to the music centres of Europe, Japan and to the United States of America. Professor of Piano at the Musikhochschule Freiburg, Germany, give masterclasses worldwide and is jury member of many international piano competitions.
